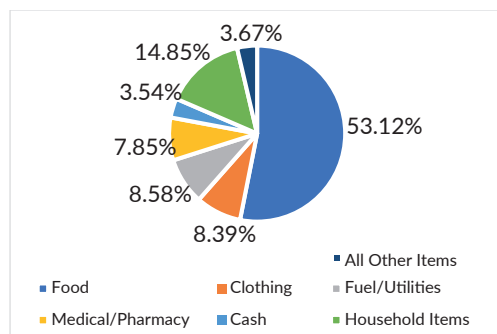
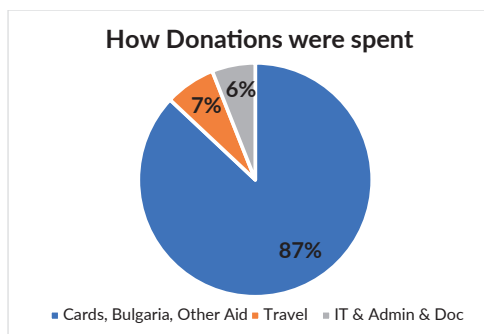

Summary of The Leavit Insitute and Dell Loy Hansen Family Foundation Card Program 2022 through May 2023

Key Facts:

- 6,000 visa gift cards distributed.
- Cards distributed to over 60 cities across Ukraine.
- Over 3,500 individuals/families received cards.
- Over 225,000 card transactions
- Aid included money for food, clothing, medicine, utilities, household goods.
- Other aid provided included generators, home rebuilds, vehicle replacement, and relocation of refugees to Bulgaria during winter months.

The Didenchuk Family

I am Nataliya Didenchuk, writing on behalf of my family and my parents' family from Mariupol. We faced unimaginable horrors during the war, unable to leave at the beginning. Our hope for a quick victory was shattered as the city turned into a blockade. Survival became a daily struggle without basic necessities. Our house was in the line of fire, and we experienced close calls and witnessed tragic scenes. Eventually, we made the difficult decision to

flee the epicenter of events, leaving behind our burned-down apartment. We are grateful for any support that can help us rebuild our lives and provide for our child's basic needs. Our gratitude extends to the organizers and everyone who has shown kindness in this difficult time!



The Sukhodoev Family

We are the Sukhodoev family from Mariupol. On February 24, our plans to celebrate our son's first birthday were replaced by a hurried escape with just one backpack. For a month, we endured living in a basement, seeking water amidst bombings, finding solace in rainwater and simple bread. In late March, we fled in fear, moving from place to place until reaching a safe haven in Ukraine. Starting anew is challenging as we have lost everything,

but our daily prayers give us hope for a future free from fear. Your support is an invaluable gift, providing clothing and warmth for our child. We cannot express enough gratitude for being our ray of hope and help.



The Family Kuznetsova Maria

We are the Kuznetsov family from Mariupol. My husband, Leonid, and I, Maria, along with our two-year-old son, David, have been through a lot. My husband defended our city, Azovstal, and was captured. After a month of blockade, my son and I finally had to leave the city. We have been waiting for almost 10 months and contemplating immigration, but it is currently not possible without my husband.

Your financial help is crucial for our basic needs and the journey ahead. Thank you for your support and understanding. A new life has begun now, even though I don't fully understand how to move forward. It is now my duty to protect my family and take them to another country.



The Kirdan Family

We are the Kirdan family from Bucha, Kyiv region. We sincerely thank you for your financial help during these difficult times of war. With your assistance, we have been able to provide warm clothes, food, and medical care for our 1.5-year-old son, who has special needs. As winter approaches, we will use the funds to purchase essential items like lighting, a flashlight, a thermos, and a power bank. We continue our struggle.

Hello, my name is Anna Kosareva. I want to express our heartfelt gratitude for your invaluable help during these difficult times. The looting and destruction have left our apartments in ruins, with roofs broken, windows blown out,

and walls crumbling. Our parents' house and outbuildings were completely destroyed. We currently reside in a rented house in the Cherkasy region, thanks to your support. Your assistance has been vital in covering our utilities, rent, food, clothing, and essential supplies for our 1.8-year-old son. Thank you for standing with us!

Thank you Dell Loy and Juliya for your great help! In Mariupol we lost everything, even our husband's father, the russists deprived us of a large part of our lives. Today you are our help and support! We are a family from Mariupol, we got out of hell on March 25. Having lived in the basements for about a month, eating once a day food that was cooked on fires, we collected water from the snow, the Russian invaders shot down our house, a mine flew

flew under the feet of my husband's father eventually he died. So we had an old mother, a disabled person of the second group, in our arms. The eldest daughter entered the university, the youngest son went to the first grade.





The Shulgach family

Good day!! We are Vitaliy Oleksiiiovych Shulgach and Valentina Vasylivna Shulgach, pensioners from Borodyanka. Because the great battles in Borodyanka, an air bomb destroyed our house, and we somehow could escape with what we had on us. There were many wanderings, and now we were sheltered in a village house, the nearest store is 5 km in one direction. The first thing we bought was a bicycle, firewood, a generator, medicine, a tonometer;

we performed a surgery for Vitaly Oleksiyovych, got fully dressed, and everything else. When you lose everything, you have to start from the beginning. You are our saviors. You are our Guardian Angels. We are infinitely grateful to you!!



The Petryakov Family

02/24/2022 changed the lives of millions and, of course, did not bypass our family. My wife and I and our three children could not even imagine that everything could change so much. The first couple of days, I could not collect myself at all, because I could not believe it. Life has stopped. After the first shock had passed, I realized that I had to do something. I had never done volunteer work before, but I understood that this was the “mite”

that I could contribute to our common victory. Your help helps to focus on volunteering and not think about how to survive and how to support the family and children. Thanks to your help and support, our family can get through this difficult time.





The Aleksin Family

"We lived in our house as a big family; we are with my husband, my son with his wife and children. We just finished repairing it. Everything was so well done and beautiful. We were so happy with our little house. When the Russians came in tanks, we hid in the cellar. It was very scary there. When it got quiet, we went out and saw how everything was completely destroyed. The last things were burning. In one moment we lost everything.

Not only our house but also our whole life was destroyed by the rascals. All we have left is what we were wearing. Now in our old age, with chronic diseases, we are left without money, without a house and without necessary things. Your help saved us in such a difficult time for us. We can buy medicine, food and necessary things . May God bless you and your family.



The Bobko Family

Valentina Bobko lives in the Brovary district. Their village was occupied by the Rashists. The Russians came to their house and took away her husband and son. Until today, their fate is unknown, Valentina has been in despair since March 2022, she cries every day. Valentina is disabled and needs help, she prays for her men, she hopes that they are in captivity. "The racists entered our village. We were in the house with our husband and son.

The racists entered the house and started threatening us. They grabbed the husband and son. I was forbidden to leave the house. When the village was liberated, I looked for them everywhere. I still do not know the fate of my husband and son. I pray to God that they are alive, maybe in captivity.





The Adamovych Family

We live in Brovary district. On March 17, the Rash-ists entered our village on tanks. My family and I hid in the kitchen, my husband and children. Russian tanks drove down the street. One tank stopped and started shooting at our house. We had an armored door in our house. We all stood behind the kitchen door and prayed. The whole house was destroyed and burned. We miraculously survived and the only door behind which we hid.

We have been building our house for 26 years. Everything was destroyed in a few minutes just like that. Nothing was left of our house. Nothing threatened them. They were just having so much fun. These are terrible people. They are not people. We were left on the street with nothing. Your support is a gift from heaven, thank you!



Bondarenko Anna

I want to start my short story with my life, which was BEFORE the war. Because we all have life divided into "before" and "after".

For as long as I can remember, I have always dreamed of my family. I got burned on my way, but three years ago I found my husband, who is a very good person, who knows how to love and respect a lot, with whom I am very happy. This is my person with whom I dream to go through with whom I

dream to go through life together. We have a love that knows no bounds.. from which a new life began.. I am a beginning entrepreneur, engaged in the production of workwear. We go to exhibitions all over Ukraine.





The Kateryna Pavlivna Family

Good afternoon, my name is Kateryna Pavlivna, I am 61 years old. I live in the village of Kolychivka, Chernihiv region. The Russians entered our village. There were heavy shelling. On March 6, 2022, I was wounded in the legs during shelling. My daughter-in-law was also injured and is currently on disability. And already on March 9, my house was destroyed. The house is not suitable for living. Thanks to good people, we got a temporary shelter.

I do not have funds for reconstruction. I am asking for help in rebuilding the house. Thank you very much for your help in such a difficult time.



The Vereshagin Family

Me, Tetyana Vereshchagina, and my family lived happily in our house until Feb. 24. The war started and my husband went to the front. The Russians reached our village. And from March 6, heavy shelling began. My family and I sat in the cellar all the time. It was very scary. The guys, the Ukrainian military, who repelled the attacks near my house, told us to run away. We left on the morning of March 6, and by evening my house had already

been destroyed and my family was left without a home. I'm ashamed now that I don't even remember the faces of those guys who said run. They are my guardian angels. Thanks to them, we survived.





The Zozulya Family

Our family lived in the village of Kalychivka, Chernihiv region. My husband and I have two children, one child is disabled. The war started and quickly came to our village. There was Ukrainian military equipment near my house. There was constant shelling. One day, an explosive shell hit our house and the house burned down completely. We miraculously survived. Now we live with friends. We dream of returning to our native village.



The Parhomenko Family

In our house at the address of Kolychivka, before the start of the war, 4 men lived permanently. From the first day of the Russian aggression, our house was near a roadblock. We began to help our servicemen and set up a canteen for soldiers. During the first big battle, a shell hit our house, and then a fire started and it was completely destroyed. We have lost everything we have earned in our lives. We really hope for help in rebuilding our house,

where we would be able to return to live again. Without your support, we will not be able to survive. May God bless you!
